## OGSTON MONTHLY SIGHTINGS REPORT -MARCH 2015

The Saturday Morning Bird Walk led by Paul Beard attracted 24 hardy souls who braved a biting wind to walk up to Milltown Quarry, where nesting Ravens were seen as well as several hundred Jackdaws. Buzzards, a Kestrel and a Peregrine were also spotted as well as the first Ringed Plover of the season. A total of 40 species were seen by the group as a whole.

**Highlights of the month:** A Blackcap was seen on the 22<sup>nd</sup> with 2 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, 3 Chiffchaff at Chapel Bay on 13th) with other sightings on most days from the 18th, ; Common Gull (1 on 6<sup>th</sup> & 60 on 14th); Curlews on 7 days; Dunlin (on 8th, 12th & 13th); 2 Egyptian Geese on the 19th, 1 Fieldfare on the 7th and 12 on the 22th, Goldcrest (5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 11<sup>th</sup>, 17<sup>th</sup>, 18<sup>th</sup> & 20<sup>th</sup>), 1 to 3 Goosanders on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> (3), 6<sup>th</sup>; 8<sup>th</sup>, 9<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup>; Green Woodpecker on  $2^{nd}$ ,  $16^{th}$  &  $19^{th}$  (2); 1 Heinei (?) Gull (Russian) on  $14^{th}$ ; on the 21st a leucistic Herring Gull was spotted by our eagle eyed gull expert, Adult Iceland Gull on 3rd & 4th, plus a 2<sup>nd</sup> winter bird on the 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> and a 3<sup>rd</sup> winter specimen on the 20<sup>th</sup>; Jackdaw (7<sup>th</sup>), a Kestrel was sighted on 8 days. Linnets were recorded on the 22<sup>nd</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup>, with 92 on the 27<sup>th</sup>, a first Little Ringed Plover of the year on the 21st, seen again on the 29th, Mandarin Duck (8th & 9<sup>th</sup>); 32 Meadow Pipits were spotted on the 223<sup>rd</sup> with 16 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, a Merlin on 27<sup>th</sup>, Peregrine (7<sup>th</sup>, 11th & 13th), the first Pintail of the year on thr 19th, Pochard (12<sup>th</sup> & 17<sup>th</sup>); Raven (7th, 9<sup>th</sup>, 10<sup>th</sup> (2), & 12<sup>th</sup>); a Red Kite was around on the 23<sup>rd</sup>, Redpoll (9<sup>th</sup>); Redshank (13th); 50 Redwings were seen on the 13th, with 20 on the 15th and 50 on the 23rd, a Ringed Plover (6th & 7th); a rare Ruddy Duck on the 25th, a Sand Martin on the 13th with 3 on the 20th, 4 Shovelers on the 13<sup>th</sup> and 5 on the 20<sup>th</sup>, ; Skylark (8<sup>th</sup>); Sparrowhawk (2<sup>nd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, 9th & 11<sup>th</sup>) Tawny Owl (9<sup>th</sup>), with another calling on the 16th & 17th; 2 Tree Sparrows on the 17th, Treecreeper (11th and 20th); c40 Whooper Swans flew NW on the 14th, with another 120 birds flying northwest on the 22<sup>nd</sup>, quite a spectacle!, Willow Tit (4<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> & 7<sup>th</sup>); 12 Woodcock on the 18th, an adult Yellow Legged Gull

was seen on the  $16^{th}$ , with 2 on the  $21^{st}$ , Yellowhammer on the  $5^{th}$  &  $7^{th}$  with 3 on the  $27^{th}$ .
