## **CARSINGTON MONTHLY BIRD REPORT - MARCH**

March Highlights: Great Northern Diver, Great White Egret, Red Kite, Red Breasted Merganser and Kittiwake but the expected spring migrants are held back by freezing weather.

The prolonged cold easterly weather held back many spring migrants such as sand martin, swallow, wheatear and blackcap so a species tally of 96 this month is reasonable. All 4 Great Northern Divers remained all month, usually found off Stones Island. A Great White Egret flew over at 0745hrs on 30<sup>th</sup> heading east-northeast. A Whooper Swan resided at Millfields 12-24<sup>th</sup> and there were also 9 on 26<sup>th</sup> and 6 on 30<sup>th</sup>. Maximum waterbird counts this month were; 2 Little Grebe on 10<sup>th</sup>, 51 Great Crested Grebe on 20<sup>th</sup>, 8 Cormorant on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5 Greylag on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 77 Canada Geese on 24<sup>th</sup>, 26 Barnacle on 1<sup>st</sup> and other days, 3 Shelduck on 17<sup>th</sup>, 43 Wigeon on 12<sup>th</sup>, 2 Gadwall on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 38 Teal on 11<sup>th</sup>, 93 Mallard on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 6 Pintail on 8<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup>, 5 Shoveler on 5<sup>th</sup>, 13 Pochard on 1<sup>st</sup>, 129 Tufted Duck on 5<sup>th</sup>, 19 Goldeneye on 3<sup>rd</sup>, a drake Red-breasted Merganser on 28<sup>th</sup>, 4 Goosander on 18<sup>th</sup> and 275 Coot on 5<sup>th</sup>.

A Red Kite drifted over the dam wall on 12<sup>th</sup> and another was seen on 17<sup>th</sup>. There were 6 Common Buzzards in the air on 30<sup>th</sup> and a Kestrel was carrying large prey, possibly blackbird, on 24<sup>th</sup>. Oystercatchers were around their breeding areas all month and at least 11 were seen on 19<sup>th</sup>. A Golden Plover was heard flying over on 15<sup>th</sup>, the maximum Lapwing count was 80 on 12<sup>th</sup> and there were 4 Dunlin flying with the Lapwing flock on 1<sup>st</sup>. Snipe were regularly seen from the Wildlife Centre, with 16 there on 18<sup>th</sup>. There were 3 Bar-tailed Godwit at the Wildlife Centre on 7-8<sup>th</sup> and 2 Black-tailed Godwit there on 15-16<sup>th</sup>. Curlew passage was building up through the month with 5 on 1<sup>st</sup>, 37 on 13<sup>th</sup> and 56 roosted on Stones Island on 24<sup>th</sup>. Redshank numbered 4 on 17<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup>.

The gull roost held an adult Mediterranean Gull on 1<sup>st</sup>, a first winter Med Gull on 14<sup>th</sup> and another was seen during the daytime on 29<sup>th</sup>. A full gull roost count from Stones Island was possible in reasonable weather on 1<sup>st</sup> and found 5000 Black-headed Gull and a new site record of 1500 Common Gull. Counts of 1000 plus Common Gull have been made from Sheepwash where only part of the roost is ever visible. There was a second winter Yellow-legged Gull in the roost on 1<sup>st</sup> and an adult around the site on 9<sup>th</sup>. Kittiwakes featured well this month with at least 3 adults on 10<sup>th</sup>, 1 staying until 15<sup>th</sup>, 2 flew through on 26<sup>th</sup> and at least 2 more flew through on 28<sup>th</sup>.

A Stock Dove flew over on 12<sup>th</sup> and 200 Woodpigeon were feeding at Hopton End on 11<sup>th</sup>. A Barn Owl was hunting around Sheepwash from 1430hrs on 12<sup>th</sup> and again on many other afternoons and a few early mornings up to the end of the month. This activity reflects their desperate search for food stretching into daylight hours during these days of freezing weather and snow covered ground. A Kingfisher was seen, mainly from Paul Stanley Hide, on 20-24<sup>th</sup>. Occasionally Skylark were noted moving northwards during the month, with a maximum of 5 on 10<sup>th</sup> and, similarly, Meadow Pipit but in bigger numbers, with 9 on the dam early on 17<sup>th</sup> and 30 over on 29<sup>th</sup>. A Rock Pipit was on the dam wall on 10<sup>th</sup>. A female Stonechat was briefly at Sheepwash on 12<sup>th</sup>, another or the same was near the Visitor Centre on the same day and a male was on Stones Island on 12<sup>th</sup>. Thrush numbers included 14 Blackbird on 28<sup>th</sup>, 8 Fieldfare on 10<sup>th</sup>, 2 Song Thrush on 28<sup>th</sup> and 200 Redwing on 31<sup>st</sup>. The first singing Chiffchaff was on Stones Island on 15<sup>th</sup>, then 3 on 17<sup>th</sup> but no more until 31<sup>st</sup> due to the freezing snowy conditions. There were 3 Raven around on 12<sup>th</sup>, 120 Starling on

 $18^{th}$ , 51 Tree Sparrow on  $7^{th}$ , a female Brambling on the Ranger Base feeder on  $13^{th}$  and 4 Greenfinch on the Visitor Centre entrance feeder on  $12^{th}$ .

96 Species recorded this March compared with 97 in March 2012, 106 in 2011, 101 in 2010, 102 in 2009, 104 in 2008, 95 in 2007 and 100 in 2006.
