## CARSINGTON MONTHLY BIRD REPORT – SEPTEMBER 2013

## September Highlights: Garganey, Osprey, Curlew Sandpiper and Great Skua.

With winter wildfowl returning, notable and maximum wildfowl counts were as follows. There were 22 Little Grebe on 19<sup>th</sup>, 36 Great Crested Grebe on 22<sup>nd</sup>, 38 Cormorant on 16<sup>th</sup>, 8 Heron on 9<sup>th</sup> and 33 Mute Swan on 9<sup>th</sup>. Pink-footed Geese included a probable feral bird most days from 10-18<sup>th</sup> and migrating flocks of 27 on 16<sup>th</sup>, 29 heading east on 20<sup>th</sup> and 100 heading west on 27<sup>th</sup>. Other Geese included 22 Greylag on 20<sup>th</sup>, 590 Canada Geese on 13<sup>th</sup> and 26 feral Barnacle Geese on 13<sup>th</sup>. Ducks were: 27 Wigeon on 2<sup>nd</sup> increasing to 302 on 30<sup>th</sup>, 17 Gadwall on 22<sup>nd</sup>, 298 Teal on 13<sup>th</sup>, 246 Mallard on 22<sup>nd</sup>, 7 Pintail on 19<sup>th</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup>, a Garganey from 16<sup>th</sup> to the end of the month, 4 Shoveler on 13<sup>th</sup>, 1 Red-crested Pochard 1-14<sup>th</sup>, 13 Pochard on 6<sup>th</sup> rising to 107 by 30<sup>th</sup>, 408 Tufted Duck on 22<sup>nd</sup>, a Scaup on 8<sup>th</sup>, a Goosander on 16<sup>th</sup> and 1057 Coot on the WeBS count on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Raptors included a juvenile male Sparrowhawk drinking on Sheepwash shoreline on 9<sup>th</sup>, an Osprey seen from the Wildlife Centre on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 2 Hobby heading south on 13<sup>th</sup> and 2 Peregrine on 22<sup>nd</sup>.

Wader passage was reasonable with 15 species including: an Oystercatcher on 2<sup>nd</sup>, a Little Ringed Plover on several days up to 25<sup>th</sup>, 24 Ringed Plover on 25<sup>th</sup>, a Grey Plover heard only on 25<sup>th</sup>, 300 Lapwing on 23<sup>rd</sup>, 2 Curlew Sandpiper on 11<sup>th</sup>, 12 Dunlin on 19-22<sup>nd</sup>, 2 Ruff on 6<sup>th</sup>, 6 Snipe on 5<sup>th</sup>, a Black-tailed Godwit on 2<sup>nd</sup> and 18<sup>th</sup>, 2 Bar-tailed Godwit on 17<sup>th</sup>, 5 Curlew on 6<sup>th</sup>, 2 Redshank on 6<sup>th</sup>, a Greenshank on 1<sup>st</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 11<sup>th</sup> and 1 to 2 Common Sandpiper all month.

A Great Skua was flying around Sheepwash at 0935hrs on 6<sup>th</sup> and flew off southwest over the dam wall just 10 minutes later. A first winter Little Gull was seen from Sheepwash on 13<sup>th</sup>. The gull roost held at least 4000 Lesser Black-backed Gull on 11<sup>th</sup> and 6 Yellow-legged Gull on 30<sup>th</sup>. An adult Kittiwake flew through heading north on 6<sup>th</sup> and a juvenile black Tern was on site most of the same day.

Summer migrants leaving were noted by the last Sand Martin on 19<sup>th</sup>, more than 100 Swallows on 20<sup>th</sup>, the last and late House Martin nest about to fledge on 8<sup>th</sup>, 3 Tree Pipit over on 12<sup>th</sup>, 33 Meadow Pipit on 18<sup>th</sup>, 2 Rock Pipit on 30<sup>th</sup>, 1 to 3 Yellow Wagtail most days up to the final 1 on 25<sup>th</sup>, 71 Pied Wagtail on the dam early on 20<sup>th</sup>, the last Wheatear on 21<sup>st</sup>, Sedge Warbler on 4<sup>th</sup>, 2 Whitethroat on 8<sup>th</sup>, 17 Chiffchaff still around on 11<sup>th</sup>, a Willow Warbler on 9<sup>th</sup> and a Spotted Flycatcher on 3<sup>rd</sup>.

There were 60 House Sparrow dust bathing together on Stones Island on 3<sup>rd</sup>, 57 Tree Sparrow on Wildlife Centre feeders on 8<sup>th</sup>, at least 90 Goldfinch on Stones Island on 13<sup>th</sup>, 19 Siskin on 25<sup>th</sup>, 4 Linnet on 12<sup>th</sup>, a Crossbill calling over Millfields on 12<sup>th</sup> and a Yellowhammer over Millfields on 20<sup>th</sup>.
