## OGSTON MONTHLY SIGHTINGS REPORT - JUNE 2015 (Up to and including 28th June.

**The Saturday Morning Bird Walk** on the 6<sup>th</sup> June was led by Paul Beard and attracted 14 members who walked in sunny but windy conditions along the West Bank to the River Amber. A total of 50 species were seen by the group as a whole.

## **Highlights of the month:**

An American Kestrel was seen on the 20<sup>th</sup>, 2 Black Tailed Godwits was seen on the 2<sup>nd</sup>; Common Sandpiper was recorded on 13<sup>th</sup>, 26<sup>th</sup> & 27, a Cuckoo was reported on the 15<sup>th</sup> and heard distantly on the 19<sup>th</sup>, Curlews were spotted on a number of occasions with a high of 6 on the 25<sup>th</sup>, a Goshawk was sighted on the 16<sup>th</sup> and a Greenshank on the 20<sup>th</sup>, a Hobby was flying around on 11<sup>th</sup> & 19<sup>th</sup> and a Kingfisher made several appearances, a Little Egret appeared on the 5th, 6<sup>th</sup>, 24<sup>th</sup> and 26-28<sup>th</sup>. An Osprey was observed fishing on 5<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup> & 23<sup>rd</sup>. One or two Red Kites were seen on the 3<sup>rd</sup>, 5<sup>th</sup>, 6<sup>th</sup> & 14<sup>th</sup>, with a Redshank on 9<sup>th</sup> & 15<sup>th</sup>. Spotted Flycatcher on 27<sup>th</sup>. One or two Whitethroats were present on 7 occasions. The Willow Tit made a welcome return, being seen on the 21<sup>st</sup>, 23<sup>rd</sup> & 26<sup>th</sup>.
